## Foreword

This volume contains the Proceedings of the 10th International Symposium on Soil Biology, entitled "Soil Biology and the Conservation of the Biosphere" organized by the Hungarian Soil Science Society and held at the University of Agriculture in Keszthely between 27 and 31 August, 1989.
